2019 Bell Brigade Guidelines

The Moscow Farmers Market has been a tradition on the Palouse since 1977 and supports youth involvement in the community. As a part of the upcoming 2019 season, the Moscow Farmers Market is introducing the Bell Brigade program. Participants shall adhere to the Moscow Farmers Market Handbook and Guidelines. Participation in the Market is at management discretion.

General Guidelines

- A chaperone must be present at all times with the youth group during market hours
- Youth must be the active participants in their group's outreach activities:
 - Selling of items is prohibited
 - Information about their group or club may be displayed
 - Donations may be collected upon prior approval from Management
 - Voice amplification devices or speakers are prohibited
- Youth group must provide their own table
- Youth groups shall only set up in the designated Bell Brigade space
- Youth are required to ring the opening and closing bells on the day they are scheduled

Scheduling

- Scheduling is at a first come, first served basis
- Commitment is for the duration of the market day (8 am to 1 pm)
- Notify Market staff one week in advance if unable to make your scheduled Saturday

Required Paperwork

Youth group supervisors and/or leaders must complete a Release and Hold Harmless form on behalf of their group before participation in the market. Youth groups who do not have a signed form will not be permitted to participate at the Market. Forms are available at the Moscow Farmers Market office in Moscow City Hall at 206 E. Third St. Moscow, ID on the third floor.
